September 11, 2002

On September 11, four U.S. planes hijacked by terrorists crashed in New York, Washington and Pennsylvania killing more than 3,000 people in a matter of hours.

Two of the hijacked airliners crashed into the World Trade Center, leveling both of the building's - 110-story twin towers. Another crashed into the Pentagon and a fourth crashed in Pennsylvania, presumably short of its target. Osama bin Laden, a Saudi terrorist, was soon implicated as the leader in these attacks, prompting a war on terrorism, with the U.S. taking the lead on finding the bin Laden-led Qaeda and Taliban forces in Afghanistan.

before September 11, 2002.

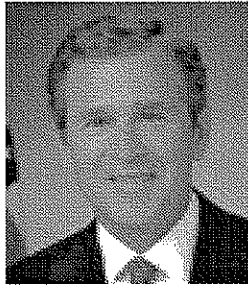


The New York Skyline

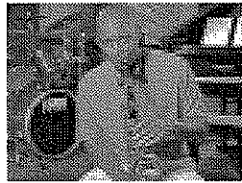

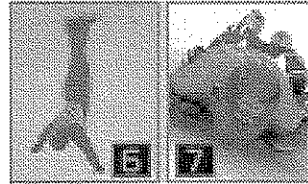
