


Knowledge, Freedom and Brotherhood


In addition, we make use of the community through such groups as social agencies, museums, businesses, and some government offices to provide other learning experiences.

Our program is characterized by close relationships between the students and the staff. All together, we here at Street Academy are very proud of our school. We wish all our past and present graduates a most successful future.











From the Coach


This year's team was small in size but big in heart. They gave their all for a winning cause. The team played hard-nose man-to-man defense from base-line to base-line.







Inner-City Players

We, the youth of today, Come forth to pave the way, For we are the leaders Of tomorrow.


